Application

This unit of competency describes the skills and knowledge required to exercise compliance powers to enforce laws relating to traditional, recreational and commercial fisheries management and other associated legislation.

The unit applies to individuals who locate evidence by searching property in locations including sea, beach, inland waterways and landings. It involves entering and searching premises including vessels and vehicles, seizing property and arresting individuals.

All work must be carried out to comply with workplace procedures, according to state/territory health and safety, food safety, biosecurity and environmental regulations, legislation and standards that apply to the workplace.

Legislative requirements apply to this unit. Users are required to check with the relevant jurisdiction for current requirements.

3. Afford rights to suspects	3.1 Treat suspects in a fair, equitable and non-discriminatory manner, and with consideration to cultural sensitivities 3.2 Ensure suspects are made aware of, and provided with, their legal entitlements under relevant jurisdictional laws and procedures
4. Assess and preserve crime/incident scenes and assist in the investigation process	4.1 Assess crime or incident scenes for future investigation requirements 4.2 Secure crime or incident scenes to facilitate potential future investigatory activity, where necessary 4.3 Ensure all actions and reports taken at crime or incident scenes optimise the gathering and preservation of evidence and its lawful presentation in court
