## Performance Evidence

An individual demonstrating competency must satisfy all of the elements and performance criteria in this unit.

There must be evidence that the individual has developed a brief of evidence for at least one court proceeding, including:

- liaising with witnesses, prosecution authority and court personnel
- presenting evidence at the proceeding in a clear and concise manner
- following up on post-proceeding matters.

## Knowledge Evidence

An individual must be able to demonstrate the knowledge required to perform the tasks outlined in the elements and performance criteria of this unit. This includes knowledge of:

- agency policies and procedures relating to preparation of documents and evidence, and providing expert opinion
- different judicial and quasi-judicial systems at which fisheries compliance matters are heard or prosecuted, and their procedures and protocols
- general principles of criminal liability
- relevant law, including the rules of evidence and continuity of evidence, policy and procedures
- role of legal personnel in judicial and quasi-judicial systems
- types of evidence admissible in judicial and quasi-judicial systems
- use of notes in courts, tribunals or commissions
- witness summons and preparation process and procedures according to jurisdictional law
- post-court procedures, including reporting outcomes of the proceedings.

## Assessment Conditions

Assessment of skills must take place under the following conditions:

- physical conditions:
  - skills must be demonstrated in a courtroom and legal setting or an environment that accurately represents workplace conditions
- resources, equipment and materials:
  - case materials, witnesses, and judicial forms
- specifications:
  - access to judicial guidelines, court protocols and procedures, including witness protection
- relationships:
  - evidence of interactions with witnesses and legal personnel.

Assessors of this unit must satisfy the requirements for assessors in applicable vocational education and training legislation, frameworks and/or standards.
