#### **Performance Evidence**

An individual demonstrating competency must satisfy all of the elements and performance criteria in this unit.

There must be evidence that the individual has:

• participated in at least five crocodile euthanasia/destruction activities.

In doing the above, there must also be evidence that the individual has:

- · complied with crocodile risk and safety standards
- euthanised or destroyed crocodiles humanely
- complied with biosecurity guidelines
- followed legislation/regulation and codes of practice associated with crocodile euthanasia or destruction.

### **Knowledge Evidence**

An individual must be able to demonstrate the knowledge required to perform the tasks outlined in the elements and performance criteria of this unit. This includes knowledge of:

- reasons for euthanising/destroying crocodiles:
  - sick crocodiles
  - population management
- equipment most commonly used for crocodile euthanasia and/or destruction:
  - electrical stunner
  - ropes
  - · capture device
  - firearms
- crocodile anatomy
- how to use different euthanasia/destruction equipment and materials
- relevant conservation legislation and codes for euthanasia/destruction methods:
  - humane bolt pistol or appropriate calibre bullet directly to the brain

- instantaneously severing the spine behind the head and immediately inserting a rod into the brain (pithing)
- the principles of animal welfare and ethics, and codes of practice relevant to crocodile welfare
- handling deceased crocodiles with dignity
- hygiene principles and cleaning processes
- · post-mortem storage if laboratory testing is required
- biosecurity guidelines for crocodile carcasses
- risks and workplace health and safety issues associated with crocodile operations
- · culturally sensitive communication protocol.

#### Assessment Conditions

Assessment of the skills in this unit of competency must take place under the following conditions:

- physical conditions:
  - skills must be demonstrated in an environment that accurately represents workplace conditions
- resources, equipment and materials, including access to:
  - appropriate firearms
  - personal protective equipment
  - live and deceased crocodiles and/or crocodile replicas where assessment would be unsafe, impractical or unethical
- specifications:
  - crocodile safety documentation, policies and procedures
- relationships:
  - relevant personnel.

Assessors of this unit must satisfy the requirements for assessors in applicable vocational education and training legislation, frameworks and/or standards.
