Performance Evidence

An individual demonstrating competency must satisfy all of the elements and performance criteria in this unit.

There must be evidence that the individual has undertaken fishing netting repair for at least two different nets on at least one occasion, including:

- using the appropriate repair tools and techniques to prepare netting material for repair
- using the appropriate repair tools, twine handling and knotting, and knotting techniques for each of the following:
 - mending holes and rips
 - repairing large scale damage.

Knowledge Evidence

An individual must be able to demonstrate the knowledge required to perform the tasks outlined in the elements and performance criteria of this unit. This includes knowledge of:

- principles of a gear plan and how it describes a net
- factors that contribute to an efficient, fast and safe net mending job
- measuring techniques for different types of netting
- order in which knots are tied to form netting material, including negative and positive knots to change lifts and impact of drag on fuel efficiencies
- safety practices for using net repair tools
- environmental requirements for disposing of damaged netting.

Assessment Conditions

Assessment of skills must take place under the following conditions:

- physical conditions:

- skills must be demonstrated in a fully operational net repair area of a fishing operations workplace or an environment that accurately represents workplace conditions
- resources, equipment and materials:
 - personal protective equipment
 - different types of netting requiring repair
 - repair tools
- specifications:
 - workplace procedures for fishing netting repairs that include advice on health and safety and environmental requirements
- relationships:
 - evidence of interactions with supervisor.

Assessors of this unit must satisfy the requirements for assessors in applicable vocational education and training legislation, frameworks and/or standards.
