Performance Evidence

The individual must demonstrate the ability to complete the tasks outlined in the elements, performance criteria and foundation skills of this unit, including evidence of the ability to:

- carry out at least 3 evidence-gathering activities.

In the course of each of the above, the individual must:

- gather evidence from at least 3 different candidates
- gather at least 2 different types of evidence
- use documentation provided by qualified assessor
- document evidence in a clear and concise manner.

Knowledge Evidence

The individual must be able to demonstrate knowledge to complete the tasks outlined in the elements, performance criteria and foundation skills of this unit, including knowledge of:

- assessment system policies and procedures and organisational requirements relevant to contributing to assessment, including:
 - policies and procedures relating to vocational education and training regulatory requirements
 - work health and safety (WHS) responsibilities
- key features of competency-based assessment
- principles of assessment and their indicators
- key purposes of assessment
- rules of evidence and their indicators
- key features of types of evidence
- evidence-gathering methods, including:
 - purpose and key features

- potential barriers
- purpose and features of assessment tools.

Assessment Conditions

Skills in this unit must be demonstrated in a real or simulated vocational education and training environment.

This includes access to:

- assessment system
- current and validated assessment tools for assessment
- a qualified assessor.

Assessors of this unit must satisfy the requirements for assessors in applicable vocational education and training legislation, frameworks and/or standards.
