Release 1. This is the first release of this unit of competency in the TLI Transport and Logistics Training Package.

Performance Evidence

Evidence required to demonstrate competence in this unit must be relevant to and satisfy all the requirements of the elements and performance criteria on at least one occasion and include:

- applying relevant legislation and workplace procedures
- applying safety precautions and required action to minimise, control or eliminate identified hazards
- completing relevant documentation
- identifying, selecting and using relevant equipment, processes and procedures
- implementing contingency plans
- operating and adapting to differences in equipment and systems in accordance with operating procedures
- planning and prioritising own work, predicting consequences and identifying improvements
- reading, interpreting and following relevant instructions, procedures and information
- selecting and using required personal protective equipment (PPE) conforming to industry and work health and safety (WHS)/occupational health and safety (OHS) standards
- working systematically with required attention to detail without injury to self or others, or damage to goods or equipment.

Knowledge Evidence

Evidence required to demonstrate competence in this unit must be relevant to and satisfy all the requirements of the elements and performance criteria and include knowledge of:

- operational work systems, equipment, management and site operating systems for sorting and consolidating mail and parcels
- relevant WHS/OHS procedures and guidelines, including relevant PPE and procedures for use
- requirements of mail sorting and consolidating systems, operations and relevant equipment
- workplace policies and procedures for sorting and consolidating mail and parcels.

Assessment Conditions

Assessors must hold credentials specified within the Standards for Registered Training

Organisations current at the time of assessment.

Assessment must satisfy the Principles of Assessment and Rules of Evidence and all regulatory requirements included within the Standards for Registered Training Organisations current at the time of assessment.

Assessment must occur in workplace operational situations where it is appropriate to do so; where this is not appropriate, assessment must occur in simulated workplace operational situations that replicate workplace conditions.

Assessment processes and techniques must be appropriate to the language, literacy and numeracy requirements of the work being performed and the needs of the candidate.

Resources for assessment must include access to:

- a range of relevant exercises, case studies and/or simulations
- relevant and appropriate materials, tools, equipment and PPE currently used in industry
- applicable documentation, including legislation, regulations, codes of practice, workplace procedures and operation manuals.
