Release 1. This is the first release of this unit of competency in the TLI Transport and Logistics Training Package.

Performance Evidence

Evidence required to demonstrate competence in this unit must be relevant to and satisfy all of the requirements of the elements and performance criteria on at least one occasion and include:

- conducting a general train examination
- identifying job hazards and taking required actions to minimise, control or eliminate identified hazards
- modifying activities depending on operational contingencies, risk situations and environments
- operating and adapting to differences in equipment in accordance with workplace procedures
- reading and interpreting relevant instructions, workplace procedures, information and signs
- reporting and/or rectifying identified problems, faults or malfunctions promptly, in accordance with regulatory requirements and workplace procedures
- selecting and using required personal protective equipment (PPE) conforming to industry and work health and safety (WHS)/occupational health and safety (OHS) requirements
- working systematically with required attention to detail without injury to self or others, or damage to goods or equipment.

Knowledge Evidence

Evidence required to demonstrate competence in this unit must be relevant to and satisfy all of the requirements of the elements and performance criteria and include knowledge of:

- emergency response procedures
- guidelines relating to equipment capability and limitations
- rail network standards and specifications for rolling stock and loads requiring examination
- relevant legislated rail safety requirements, codes of practice and/or guidelines
- relevant rail danger zones
- relevant rail safety, WHS/OHS, and environmental workplace procedures and regulations
- relevant workplace policies and procedures for conducting a general train examination.

Assessment Conditions

Assessors must hold credentials specified within the Standards for Registered Training Organisations current at the time of assessment.

Assessment must satisfy the Principles of Assessment and Rules of Evidence and all regulatory requirements included within the Standards for Registered Training Organisations current at the time of assessment.

Assessment must occur in workplace operational situations where it is appropriate to do so; where this is not appropriate, assessment must occur in simulated workplace operational situations that replicate rail corridor workplace conditions.

Assessment processes and techniques must be appropriate to the language, literacy and numeracy requirements of the work being performed and the needs of the candidate.

Resources for assessment must include access to:

- a range of relevant exercises, case studies and/or simulations
- relevant and appropriate materials, tools, equipment and PPE currently used in industry
- applicable documentation including workplace procedures, regulations, codes of practice and operation manuals.
