Performance Evidence

Evidence required to demonstrate competence in this unit must be relevant to and satisfy all of the requirements of the elements and performance criteria on at least one occasion and include:

- applying precautions and required action to minimise, control or eliminate identified hazards
- carrying out one routine maintenance in a safe manner
- communicating and working effectively with others
- completing a pre-operational check on one piece of equipment used in the job function
- modifying activities depending on operational contingencies, risk situations and environments
- monitoring performance of equipment
- monitoring work activities in terms of planned schedule
- operating and adapting to differences in equipment in accordance with workplace procedures
- operating mechanical equipment to manufacturer and workplace requirements
- reporting identified problems, faults and malfunctions promptly, in accordance with organisational procedures
- selecting and using required personal protective equipment
- working systematically with required attention to detail without injury to self or others, or damage to goods or equipment.

Knowledge Evidence

Evidence required to demonstrate competence in this unit must be relevant to and satisfy all of the requirements of the elements and performance criteria and include knowledge of:

- emergency procedures
- problems that can occur when using and maintaining minor mechanical equipment and related action that should be taken to resolve these problems
- relevant work health and safety (WHS)/occupational health and safety (OHS) and

- environmental procedures and regulations
- tools and equipment for using and maintaining minor mechanical equipment, and the procedures and precautions for their care, use and storage
- workplace documentation and records requirements
- workplace procedures for using and maintaining minor mechanical equipment.

Assessment Conditions

As a minimum, assessors must satisfy applicable regulatory requirements, which include requirements in the *Standards for Registered Training Organisations* current at the time of assessment.

As a minimum, assessment must satisfy applicable regulatory requirements, which include requirements in the *Standards for Registered Training Organisations* current at the time of assessment.

Assessment must occur in workplace operational situations where it is appropriate to do so; where this is not appropriate, assessment must occur in simulated workplace operational situations that replicate workplace conditions.

Assessment processes and techniques must be appropriate to the language, literacy and numeracy requirements of the work being performed and the needs of the candidate.

Resources for assessment include:

- a range of relevant exercises, case studies and/or simulations
- applicable documentation including workplace procedures, regulations, codes of practice and operation manuals
- relevant materials, tools, equipment and personal protective equipment currently used in industry.
