Assessment Requirements for TLIF0016 Working at height in the stevedoring industry

Release 1. This is the first release of this unit of competency in the TLI Transport and Logistics Training Package.

Performance Evidence

Evidence required to demonstrate competence in this unit must be relevant to and satisfy all of the requirements of the elements and performance criteria on at least one occasion and include:

- applying precautions and required action to minimise, control or eliminate identified hazards prior to and whilst working at height
- communicating effectively with others
- completing relevant documentation
- following relevant instructions, workplace procedures, information and signs
- identifying, selecting and inspecting working at height equipment
- post-operational inspection and storage reporting faults in accordance with workplace procedures
- using correct manual handling techniques
- using personal protective equipment (PPE) in accordance with workplace procedures
- using relevant working at height equipment
- working from a work cage when working at height.

Knowledge Evidence

Evidence required to demonstrate competence in this unit must be relevant to and satisfy all of the requirements of the elements and performance criteria and include knowledge of:

- codes of practice and regulations relevant to working at height
- manual handling methods for working at height
- relevant sections of Australian Maritime Safety Authority (AMSA) Marine Orders Part 32 Cargo handling equipment
- relevant work health and safety (WHS)/occupational health and safety (OHS) guidelines and workplace procedures
- · risk assessment policies and procedures
- · risks and hazards involved in working at height and related risk control measures
- working at height emergency response procedures
- working at height equipment checks
- workplace procedures for using working at height equipment.

Assessment Conditions

Assessors must hold credentials specified within the Standards for Registered Training Organisations current at the time of assessment.

Assessment must satisfy the Principles of Assessment and Rules of Evidence and all regulatory requirements included within the Standards for Registered Training Organisations current at the time of assessment.

Assessment must occur in workplace operational situations where it is appropriate to do so; where this is not appropriate, assessment must occur in simulated workplace operational situations that replicate workplace conditions.

Assessment processes and techniques must be appropriate to the language, literacy and numeracy requirements of the work being performed and the needs of the candidate.

Resources for assessment must include:

- relevant materials, tools, working at height equipment and PPE
- applicable documentation, including workplace procedures, emergency response plan, regulations, codes of practice, manufacturer specifications and operation manuals.
