# Assessment Requirements for TLIG0002 Lead a work team

## Modification History

**Release 1.** This is the first release of this unit of competency in the TLI Transport and Logistics Training Package.

## Performance Evidence

Evidence required to demonstrate competence in this unit must be relevant to and satisfy all the requirements of the elements and performance criteria on at least one occasion and include:

- applying relevant legislation and workplace procedures
- coaching and mentoring team members
- completing relevant documentation
- monitoring and prioritising team activities in terms of planned schedule
- negotiating and working effectively with team members
- planning team activities, including predicting consequences and identifying improvements
- reading, interpreting and following relevant instructions and workplace procedures.

## Knowledge Evidence

Evidence required to demonstrate competence in this unit must be relevant to and satisfy all the requirements of the elements and performance criteria and include knowledge of:

- coaching and mentoring approaches
- problems when leading a work team and appropriate solutions
- relevant legislation
- relevant work health and safety (WHS)/occupational health and safety (OHS) policies and procedures
- techniques to encourage appropriate participation of team members
- workplace policies and procedures for leading work teams.

## Assessment Conditions

Assessors must hold credentials specified within the Standards for Registered Training Organisations current at the time of assessment.

Assessment must satisfy the Principles of Assessment and Rules of Evidence and all regulatory requirements included within the Standards for Registered Training Organisations current at the time of assessment.

Assessment must occur in workplace operational situations where it is appropriate to do so; where this is not appropriate, assessment must occur in simulated workplace operational

situations that replicate workplace conditions.

Assessment processes and techniques must be appropriate to the language, literacy and numeracy requirements of the work being performed and the needs of the candidate.

Resources for assessment must include access to:

- a range of relevant exercises, case studies and/or simulations
- relevant and appropriate materials, tools, equipment and personal protective equipment (PPE) currently used in industry
- applicable documentation, including legislation, regulations, codes of practice, workplace procedures and operation manuals.
