Release 1. This is the first release of this unit of competency in the TLI Transport and Logistics Training Package.

Application

This unit involves the skills and knowledge required to identify major roads, services and attractions.

It includes locating major roads, highways and suburbs in area of operation; and locating transport interchanges, jetties, ports, stations and terminals. It also includes identifying main public services and facilities and locating key features in a central business district on a map.

Work is performed with limited supervision, and with duty of care responsibility for self and others in achieving the prescribed outcomes.

This unit meets part of the certification requirements for obtaining specialist driver accreditations. As requirements may vary between states and territories, people seeking specialist driver accreditation should contact their state/territory licensing regulator.

| 3 Identify main public services and facilities | 3.1 Key tourist locations are located on a map and their features are communicated |
| | 3.2 Key public services and facilities are located on a map and communicated |
| | 3.3 Main scenic routes, places and landmarks of interest to tourists are determined and features are communicated |
| 4 Locate key features in a central business district | 4.1 Streets, major buildings and traffic flow directions of central business district and city centre are identified and located on a map |
| | 4.2 City hotels are identified and located on a map |
| | 4.3 Exit and entry points to city are determined in relation to a final destination |
| | 4.4 Transport interchanges and passenger pickup and drop-off areas in central business district and city centre are identified and located on a map |
