# Assessment Requirements for TLIPC0002 Plan and prepare to work in a supply chain environment

## Modification History

**Release 1.** This is the first release of this unit of competency in the TLI Transport and Logistics Training Package.

## Performance Evidence

Evidence required to demonstrate competence in this unit must be relevant to and satisfy all the requirements of the elements and performance criteria on at least one occasion and include:

- adapting and modifying activities depending on differing workplace contexts and environments
- communicating effectively and using appropriate strategies when working in a diverse environment
- identifying and following relevant workplace policies and procedures
- identifying personal learning needs and skill gaps
- identifying supply chain industry products, services and sectors
- recognising limitations, asking for help and seeking clarification or information about work requirements and procedures
- using time management strategies
- using workplace technology.

## Knowledge Evidence

Evidence required to demonstrate competence in this unit must be relevant to and satisfy all the requirements of the elements and performance criteria and include knowledge of:

- key industry sectors in the supply chain environment
- learning opportunities in the workplace
- relevant workplace policies and procedures
- roles and responsibilities in the supply chain environment
- time management strategies and appropriate workplace etiquette
- workplace equipment, tools and other technologies used in the supply chain environment.

## Assessment Conditions

Assessors must hold credentials specified within the Standards for Registered Training

Organisations current at the time of assessment.

Assessment must satisfy the Principles of Assessment and Rules of Evidence and all regulatory requirements included within the Standards for Registered Training Organisations current at the time of assessment.

Assessment must occur in workplace operational situations where it is appropriate to do so; where this is not appropriate, assessment must occur in simulated workplace operational situations that replicate workplace conditions.

Assessment processes and techniques must be appropriate to the language, literacy and numeracy requirements of the work being performed and the needs of the candidate.

Resources for assessment must include access to:

- a range of relevant exercises, case studies and/or simulations
- relevant and appropriate materials, tools, equipment and personal protective equipment (PPE) currently used in industry
- applicable documentation, including legislation, regulations, codes of practice, workplace procedures and operation manuals.
