Performance Evidence

Evidence required to demonstrate competence in this unit must be relevant to and satisfy all the requirements of the elements and performance criteria on at least one occasion and includes

- applying supply chain policies and procedures
- ascertaining personnel and roles in market supply systems
- collating and assessing evaluation data to identify trends and challenges
- confirming:
 - marketing, distribution and sales functions and contributions
 - suppliers of supporting goods and services
- determining market supply system customers, flows, materials and products
- developing improvements to the market supply system in consultation with stakeholders
- establishing the origin of products, materials and services
- evaluating strengths and weaknesses of the market supply system using approved methods and tools
- identifying producers, buyers, consumers and entities that influence the market supply system
- monitoring legislative and regulatory obligations
- preparing and disseminating reports to approved stakeholders
- reviewing specifications
- specifying supply criteria for materials and products
- tracking flow rates and Key Performance Indicators (KPIs)
- updating market supply system records
- using:
 - approved electronic digital systems and tools
 - established quality indicators to verify materials and products
 - industry terminology to communicate with stakeholders
- verifying level of authority for performance in the market supply system.

Knowledge Evidence

Evidence required to demonstrate competence in this unit must be relevant to and satisfy all the requirements of the elements and performance criteria and includes knowledge of

- communication methods and tools
- electronic systems and digital tools including bar coding, point of sale, electronic payment, stock control, ordering and digital application systems
- entities that influence market supply systems
- evaluation data used to identify trends and challenges
- flows in market supply systems
- functions and contributions of marketing, sales and distribution in market supply systems
- industry terminology
- Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) for market supply systems
- legislative and regulatory requirements
- origin of products, materials and services in market supply systems
- preparation requirements for reports
- producers, buyers and consumers in market supply systems
- quality indicators for verifying materials and products
- record keeping and report requirements
- roles and personnel in market supply systems
- specifications for materials and products
- strengths and weaknesses in market supply systems
- supplier relationships and production processes and conditions in market supply systems
- supply chain policies and procedures
- supply criteria for products and materials
- supporting goods and services in market supply systems
- types of market supply systems.

Assessment Conditions

Assessors must hold credentials specified within the Standards for Registered Training Organisations current at the time of assessment.

Assessment must satisfy the Principles of Assessment and Rules of Evidence and all regulatory requirements included within the Standards for Registered Training Organisations current at the time of assessment.

Assessment must occur in workplace operational situations where it is appropriate to do so. Where this is not appropriate, assessment must occur in simulated workplace operational situations that replicate workplace conditions.

Assessment processes and techniques must be appropriate to the language, literacy and numeracy requirements of the work being performed and the needs of the candidate.

Resources for assessment must include access to a range of

- exercises, case studies or other simulations
- materials, tools and equipment used in industry
- documentation including organisational policies and procedures, industry standards, regulations, codes of practice, operational manuals and equipment specifications.
