Release 1. This is the first release of this unit of competency in the TLI Transport and Logistics Training Package.

Performance Evidence

Evidence required to demonstrate competence in this unit must be relevant to and satisfy all of the requirements of the elements and performance criteria on at least one occasion and include:

- applying correct preference scheme and rule of origin
- assessing evidence of compliance accurately
- establishing origin code, preference scheme and rule of origin
- identifying and applying consignment rules
- identifying the requirements of preference schemes and/or free trade agreements
- interpreting and applying relevant free trade agreement
- identifying:
 - eligible goods for preference purposes
 - places and countries where preferential tariff rates may apply.

Knowledge Evidence

Evidence required to demonstrate competence in this unit must be relevant to and satisfy all of the requirements of the elements and performance criteria and include knowledge of:

- Australia's current free trade agreements
- free trade agreements that Australia has under negotiation
- function of a Certificate of Origin or Declaration of Origin
- how to determine:
 - duty rates under preferential tariff schemes and free trade agreements
 - consignment rules under preferential tariff schemes and free trade agreements
 - rules of origin under preferential tariff schemes and free trade agreements
- legislative requirements for determining:
 - eligibility for preferential rates
 - origin of goods
- mandatory content of a Certificate and/or Declaration of Origin
- types of preferential tariff schemes including classes of countries and places where special rates apply
- use of advance ruling

- benefits and use
- origin of advance rulings
- review processes.

Assessment Conditions

Assessors must hold credentials specified within the Standards for Registered Training Organisations current at the time of assessment.

Assessment must satisfy the Principles of Assessment and Rules of Evidence and all regulatory requirements included within the Standards for Registered Training Organisations current at the time of assessment.

Assessment must occur in workplace operational situations where it is appropriate to do so; where this is not appropriate, assessment must occur in simulated workplace operational situations that replicate workplace conditions.

Assessment processes and techniques must be appropriate to the language, literacy and numeracy requirements of the work being performed and the needs of the candidate.

Resources for assessment must include access to:

- a range of relevant exercises, case studies and/or simulations
- applicable documentation including workplace procedures, regulations, codes of practice and operation manuals.
