Performance Evidence

Evidence required to demonstrate competence in this unit must be relevant to and satisfy all the requirements of the elements, performance criteria and range of conditions on at least two separate occasions and includes:

- applying legislation, industry standards, codes of practice and regulations
- communicating with personnel
- completing tool store duties
- · interpreting manufacturers' specifications and manuals
- · issuing and maintaining tools, consumable items and associated equipment
- maintaining tool stores documentation and records
- preparing and planning tool store work
- using tool ordering procedures
- Work, Health and Safety (WHS)/Occupational Health and Safety (OHS) regulations including:
 - emergency procedures
 - risk control measures
 - safe working practices

Knowledge Evidence

Evidence required to demonstrate competence in this unit must be relevant to and satisfy all the requirements of the elements, performance criteria and range of conditions and includes knowledge of:

- consumable items and tool storage
- · documenting and reporting tool store inventory
- legislation, industry standards, codes of practice and regulations
- maintenance requirements
- ordering and maintaining tool store procedures
- · tool attachments and accessories
- tool names, types and their uses
- WHS/OHS requirements including:

- emergency procedures
- risk control measures
- safe working practices
- workplace policies and procedures
- workplace documentation

Assessment Conditions

As a minimum, assessors must satisfy applicable regulatory requirements, which include requirements in the Standards for Registered Training Organisations current at the time of assessment.

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Assessment processes and techniques must be appropriate to the language, literacy and numeracy requirements of the work being performed and the needs of the candidate.

Assessment must occur in workplace operational situations. Where this is not appropriate, assessment must occur in simulated workplace operational situations that reflect workplace conditions.

Resources for assessment must include access to:

- a range of relevant exercises, case studies and/or other simulations
- relevant and appropriate materials, tools, equipment and personal protective equipment currently used in industry
- applicable documentation including workplace procedures, industry standards, equipment specifications, regulations, codes of practice and operation manuals.
