Application

This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to trim the rumen to recover the mountain chain for further processing.

This unit applies to individuals who work under general supervision in the tripe or paunch room of a meat processing premises.

All work must be carried out to comply with workplace procedures, according to state/territory health and safety and food safety regulations, legislation and standards that apply to the workplace.

Mandatory workplace requirements apply to the assessment of this unit.

Assessment Requirements for AMPOFF212 Recover mountain chain

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1	This unit of competency was first released in AMP Australian Meat Processing Training Package Release 9.0.

Performance Evidence

An individual demonstrating competency must satisfy all of the elements and performance criteria in this unit.

There must be evidence that the individual has recovered mountain chain for further processing, following workplace requirements, in a micro or larger meat processing premises.

In micro meat processing premises

The assessor must observe the individual working on a minimum of two mountain chain.

There must also be evidence that the individual has completed two shifts on the job, fulfilling workplace requirements (these shifts may include normal rotations into and out of the relevant work task).

In larger meat processing premises

The assessor must observe the individual working on a minimum of eight mountain chain or for 15 minutes, whichever comes first.

There must also be evidence that the individual has completed two shifts on the job, fulfilling workplace requirements (these shifts may include normal rotations into and out of the relevant work task).

Mandatory workplace requirements

All performance evidence specified above must be demonstrated in a meat processing premises.

Knowledge Evidence

An individual must be able to demonstrate the knowledge required to perform the tasks outlined in the elements and performance criteria of this unit. This includes knowledge of:

- workplace requirements for recovering mountain chain
- impact of inadequately trimmed product being packed or processed
- mountain chain specifications
- possible defects in mountain chain
- sources of contamination and cross-contamination and how they are controlled

- workplace health and safety, and hygiene and sanitation requirements related to processing mountain chain.

Assessment Conditions

Assessment of the skills in this unit of competency must take place under the following conditions:

- physical conditions:
 - skills must be demonstrated in a meat processing premises at workplace production speed
- resources, equipment and materials:
 - personal protective equipment
 - rumen and mountain chain for processing
- specifications:
 - mountain chain specifications
 - task-related documents
- personnel:
 - access to workplace supervisor or mentor.

Assessment for this unit must include at least three forms of evidence.

Assessors of this unit must satisfy the requirements for assessors in applicable vocational education and training legislation, frameworks and/or standards.
