Application

This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to pack and label meat products, using automatic packaging and labelling equipment.

This unit applies to individuals who work under general supervision in meat processing premises.

All work must be carried out to comply with workplace procedures, according to state/territory health and safety and food safety regulations, legislation and standards that apply to the workplace.

Assessment Requirements for AMPPKG210 Package product using automatic packing and labelling equipment

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Performance Evidence

An individual demonstrating competency must satisfy all of the elements and performance criteria in this unit.

There must be evidence that the individual has packed and labelled meat products, to meet workplace requirements.

The assessor must observe the individual using automatic packing and labelling equipment, including the set-up, for a minimum of 15 minutes.

There must also be evidence that the individual has completed two shifts on the job, fulfilling workplace requirements (these shifts may include normal rotations into and out of the relevant work task).

Mandatory workplace requirements

All performance evidence specified above must be demonstrated in a meat processing premises.

Knowledge Evidence

An individual must be able to demonstrate the knowledge required to perform the tasks outlined in the elements and performance criteria of this unit. This includes knowledge of:

- workplace requirements for packaging products using automatic packing and labelling equipment
- operating principles of automatic packing and labelling equipment and its features, including parts, safety features, start-up and shut-down procedures, possible faults and adjustments
- how to adjust settings on equipment
- hygiene and sanitation requirements for equipment and process
- corrective actions for faults with equipment or process
- methods of recording production
- workplace health and safety hazards for using automatic packing and labelling equipment, the associated risks and how the risks are controlled.

Assessment Conditions

Assessment of the skills in this unit of competency must take place under the following conditions:

- physical conditions:
 - skills must be demonstrated in a meat processing premises at workplace production speed
- resources, equipment and materials:
 - personal protective equipment
 - meat products for packing and labelling
 - packing and labelling consumables
- specifications:
 - task-related documents
- personnel:
 - access to workplace supervisor or mentor.

Assessment for this unit must include at least three forms of evidence.

Assessors of this unit must satisfy the requirements for assessors in applicable vocational education and training legislation, frameworks and/or standards.
