Application

This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to pack and dispatch a range of rendered products such as meat meal, blood meal and tallow.

This unit applies to those who work under general supervision in a meat processing plant, who pack or store rendered product in containers and dispatch either in bulk or in bags.

All work must be carried out to comply with workplace procedures, according to state/territory health and safety and food safety regulations, legislation and standards that apply to the workplace.

Mandatory workplace requirements apply to the assessment of this unit.

4. Check quality assurance (QA) aspects of delivery trucks	4.1 Identify quality assurance requirements for trucks leaving the plant 4.2 Undertake QA check of truck following work instructions

Assessment Requirements for AMPREN203 Pack and dispatch rendered products

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Performance Evidence

An individual demonstrating competency must satisfy all of the elements and performance criteria in this unit.

There must be evidence that the individual has packed and dispatched rendered products, following workplace procedures.

The assessor must observe the individual packing and dispatching rendered products for a minimum of 15 minutes.

There must also be evidence that the individual has completed two shifts on the job, fulfilling workplace requirements (these shifts may include normal rotations into and out of the relevant work task).

Mandatory workplace requirements

All performance evidence specified above must be demonstrated in a rendering premises.

Knowledge Evidence

An individual must be able to demonstrate the knowledge required to perform the tasks outlined in the elements and performance criteria of this unit. This includes knowledge of:

- workplace requirements for packing and dispatching rendered products
- rendered products that are packed, stored and dispatched at work site
- operating principles of packing and storing equipment
- consumables required for packaging
- workplace health and safety hazards encountered when packing and dispatching rendered products, and how the associated risks are controlled
- contamination and cross-contamination risks that can occur when packing and dispatching rendered products, and ways to avoid risks
- quality assurance requirements for delivery trucks.

Assessment Conditions

Assessment of the skills in this unit of competency must take place under the following conditions:

- physical conditions:
 - skills must be demonstrated in a rendering premises at workplace production speed
- resources, equipment and materials:
 - personal protective equipment
 - rendered product for packing or storing
 - packing and storing equipment
 - packing consumables
 - delivery truck
- specifications:
 - task-related documents
- personnel:
 - access to workplace supervisor or mentor.

Assessment for this unit must include at least three forms of evidence.

Assessors of this unit must satisfy the requirements for assessors in applicable vocational education and training legislation, frameworks and/or standards.
