Application

This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to prepare and present vehicle crash analysis and conclusions as admissible evidence and specialist opinion as part of judicial proceedings.

This unit applies to those working as police employees involved in vehicle crash analysis.

The skills and knowledge described in this unit must be applied within the legislative, regulatory and policy environment in which they are undertaken. Organisational policies and procedures must be consulted and adhered to, particularly those related to judicial processes.

Those undertaking this role would work autonomously or as part of a team while remaining responsible for reporting to senior staff. They would demonstrate the ability to perform tasks in a broad range of contexts.

Assessment Requirements for POLINV043 Present evidence on crash incidents

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Performance Evidence

Evidence required to demonstrate competence in this unit must be relevant to and satisfy all of the requirements of the elements and performance criteria on at least one occasion and include:

- communicating analysis to judicial audiences
- preparing and presenting demonstrative tools, evidence and exhibits to the judiciary
- preparing and presenting evidence in a judicial setting.

Knowledge Evidence

Evidence required to demonstrate competence in this unit must be relevant to and satisfy all of the requirements of the elements and performance criteria and include knowledge of:

- developing visual representations of crash analysis
- judicial legislation and policies on presenting expert evidence
- roles and responsibilities of stakeholders in the judicial process
- rules and types of evidence in various judicial settings.

Assessment Conditions

Assessment must occur in operational workplace situations or, where this is not available, in simulated situations that replicate workplace conditions.

Assessors of this unit must satisfy relevant vocational education and training legislation, frameworks and/or standards.
