Planning and organising	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> assess work load identify factors affecting work requirements, assess the impact and take appropriate action to ensure work requirements are met identify hazards and assess risks open and prepare the operations centre by activating communications systems, and accessing appropriate plans and directories in accordance with unit standing operating procedures prepare and respond to rescues set priorities within allocated timeframes
Self-management	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> conduct oneself at all times in accordance with organisation's policies, procedures and standards manage own work monitor own work observe designated dress codes participate in programs to ensure level of expertise meets organisation's requirements
