- Collaborate with others in the course of rail operations
- Work with persons of different ages, gender, race, religion, political persuasion, etc.

#### **Problem solving**

- Identify and solve or report problems arising in the course of rail operations
- Monitor and anticipate problems that may occur in the course of rail operations including hazards and risks and take appropriate action to report or resolve the problems within limits of responsibility
- Recognise hazards and risks in a range of rail situations and take appropriate precautions
- Use mathematics to solve various calculations related to rail operations.

#### Initiative and enterprise

- Modify activities dependent on differing situations and contingencies that may arise during rail operations
- Take appropriate initiatives in a range of operational situations such as those above
- Respond appropriately to any changes in equipment,

- up to **2 suitable units** (aligned at AQF 1) drawn with appropriate contextualisation from other Transport and Logistics Certificate I qualifications, other relevant endorsed Training Package or accredited course.
